

"An intensifying climate crisis would bring about a <u>fundamental reshaping of finance</u>, with a significant reallocation of capital set to take place sooner than most anticipate.

Larry Fink, CEO Blackrock, World Economic Forum 2020 "Sustainability matters to investors," says Prof. Amel-Zadeh. Their study found that companies with a good sustainability rating received 15 per cent per cent more investment from wealthy investors every month over the years 2016-19, compared to those with a low rating.





More than 90% of sustainable **indices** outperformed their parent benchmark during the period of the heightened market uncertainty and drawdown associated with this crisis.

Figure 1: Changes expected to investment activity (planned capital invested)






Topics in ESG finance

 - Human rights and environmental due diligence management




Prevalance of Modern Slavery Worldwide





On any given day in 2016...



METRICS

40 million people were victims of modern slavery. This includes:

- · 25 million people in forced labour
- 15 million people in forced marriage

PREVALENCE

There were 5.4 victims of modern slavery for every thousand people in the world in 2016.

There were 5.9 adult victims of modern slavery for every 1,000 adults in the world and 4.4 child victims for every 1,000 children in the world.







GENDER

Women and girls accounted for 71 per cent of modern slavery victims.



DEBT BONDAGE

Debt bondage affected half of all victims of forced labour imposed by private actors.





CHILDREN



One in four victims of modern slavery were children.

Migrant Labour in Tourism

- 330 Million jobs in tourism worldwide (2019)
- 10-25% of all workers in tourism are foreignborn (16% in Europe, 20% in US)

Advantages for migrant workers	Dis-advantages for migrant workers
Labour-intensive sector	A lot of invisible labour involve (outsourcing and subcontracting also)
Low-skilled jobs, training minimal	Low-paid jobs, long hours, poor accomodation, minimal security
Remittances potential	Unethical recruitment, high fees and costs, contract substitution, debt bondage
Own migration background (inter- culturally an asset)	Higher risk of exploitation due to discrimination, isolation/language



A brief overview of Modern Slavery Legislation

INTERNATIONAL LEGISLATION ON MODERN SLAVERY

- California Transparency in Supply Chains Act (2010)
- UK Modern Slavery Act (2015)
- French Corporate Duty of Vigilance Law (2017)
- Australian Modern Slavery Act (2018)
- Tariff Act of 1930 (US Customs and Border Protection (CBP))



All work or service that is exacted from any person under the threat of a penalty and for which the person has not offered himself or herself voluntarily.



All work or service which is exacted from any person under the menace of any penalty for its non-performance and for which the worker does not offer himself voluntarily.






RECRUITMENT FEES BY NATIONALITY



Investors raise concerns about migrant workers' rights in Gulf

DUBAI (Reuters) - A group of investors is raising concerns about the treatment of migrant workers in the Gulf, warning that labour practices risk leading to abuses such as modern slavery.
