

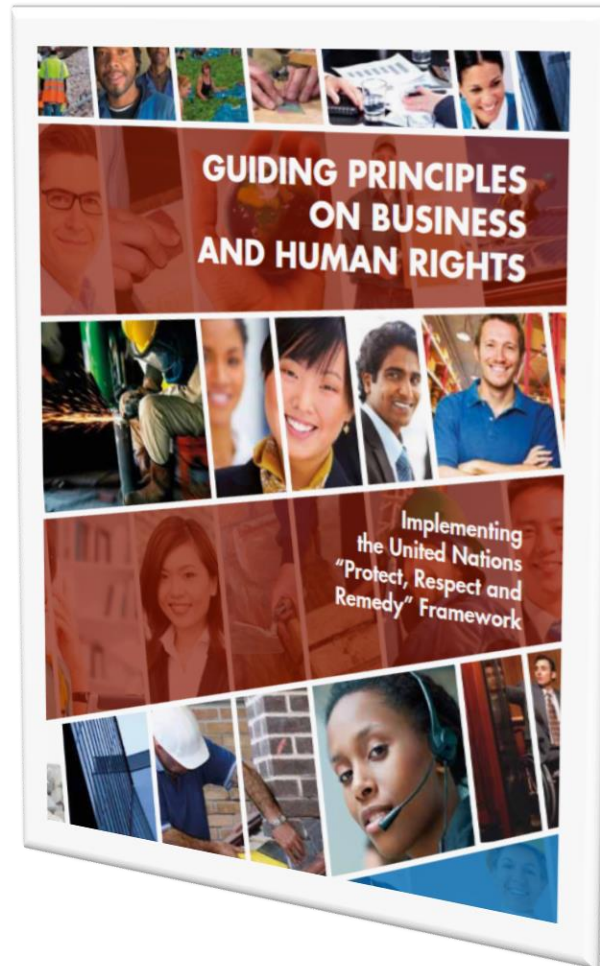

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# Origin of National Action Plans (NAP)

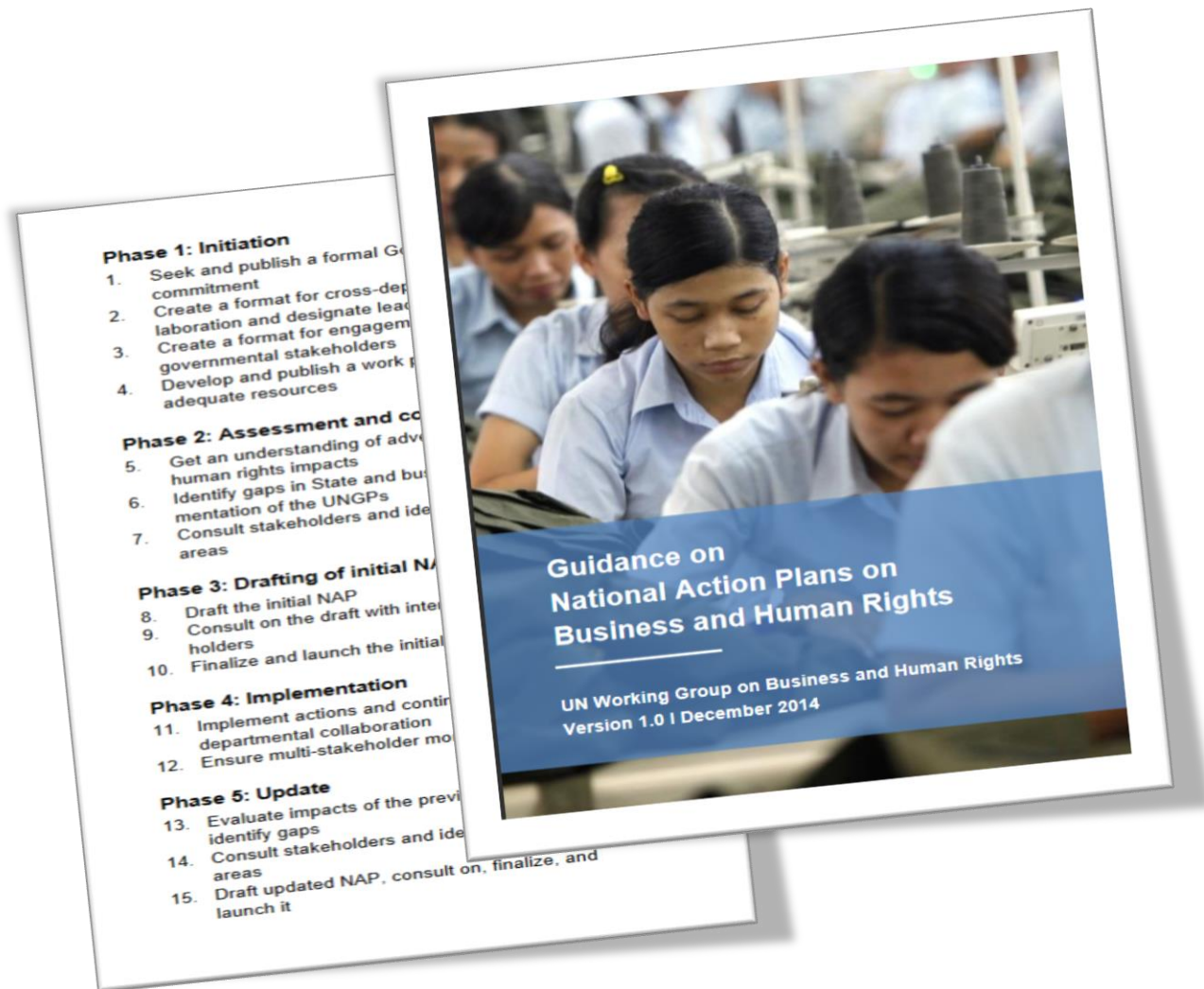


## Three Pillars

# UNWG Guidance on NAP

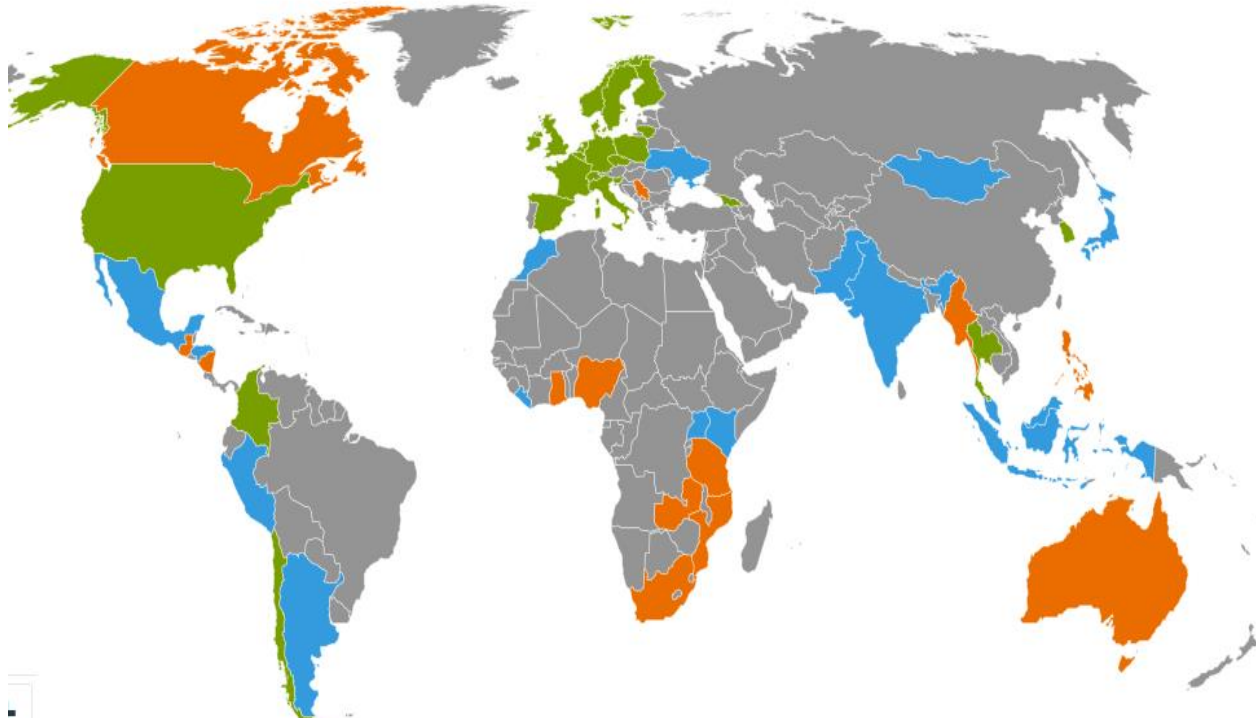
